A knight was a person who worked for the king. Usually it was someone who had a lot of money. This is because knights needed a horse, a sword and a shield. These were very expensive! Men first became knights in (1) 700. They helped the king and the king gave them land. Knights were important people because they had a lot of money and land. Later, the knights made their own groups. One of the first groups were the (2) _____, who started in 1023. They helped people who were ill.

In 1348, King Edward III of England started a famous group of knights: the (3) _____. Then, in the (4) _____, many knights gave money to the king so they didn't have to help him. The king used this money to get other people to help him.

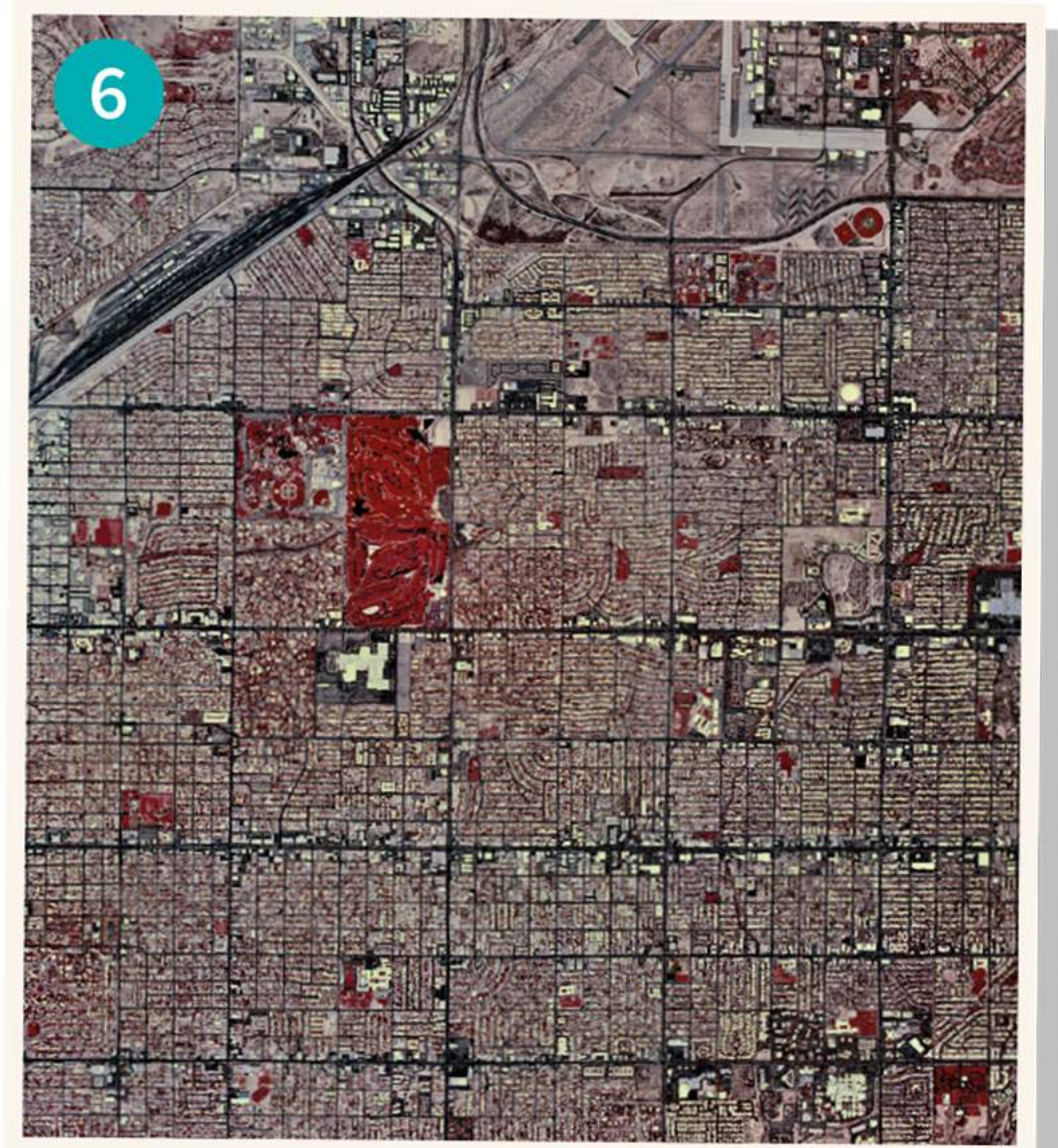
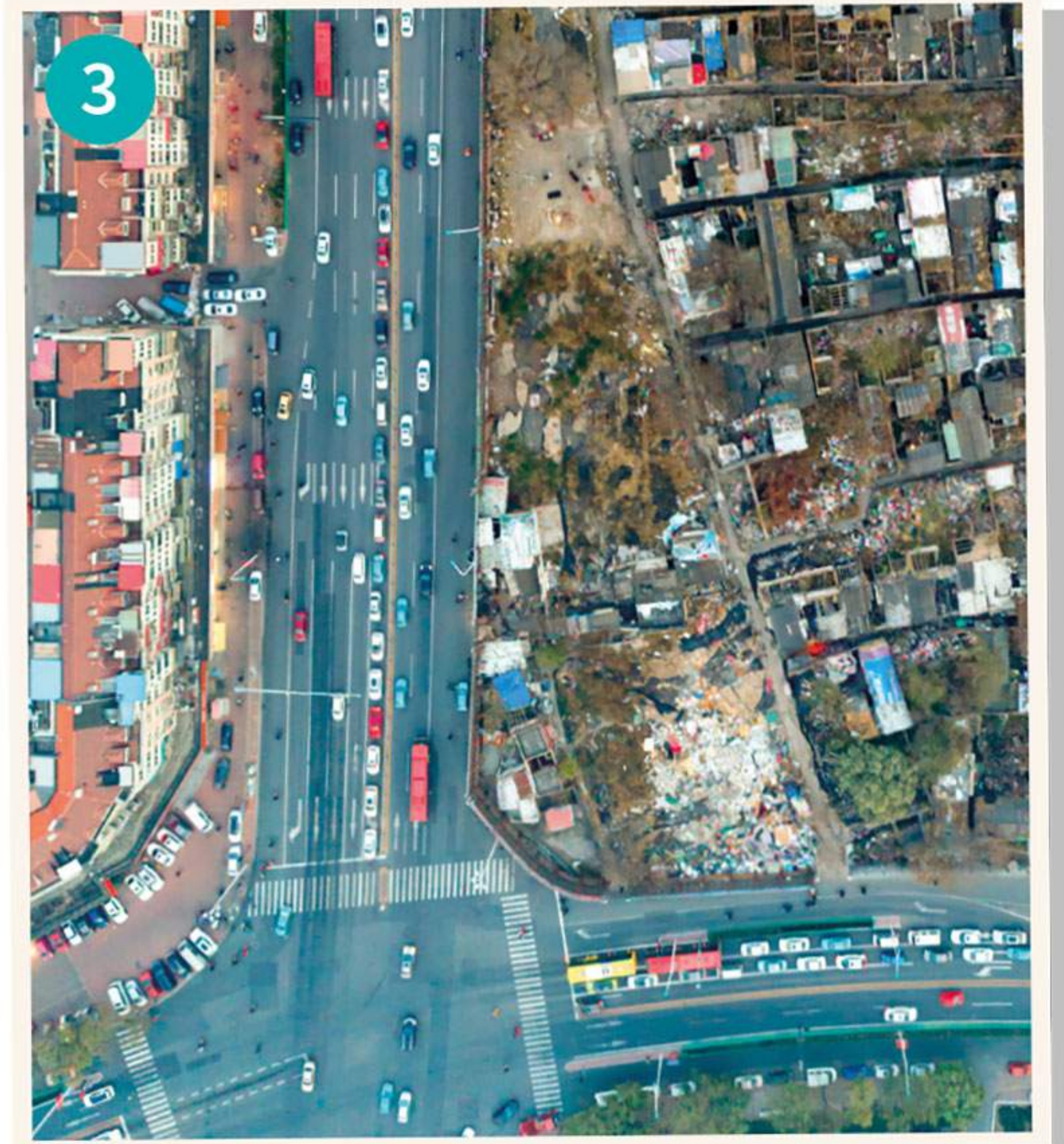
A satellite is an object that goes around a planet. There are two different kinds of satellite: natural satellites and artificial satellites. The moon is a natural satellite. It goes around the Earth. Other planets have natural satellites too. Artificial satellites are made by people and then put in space. Some artificial satellites help us by taking photos of space. They tell us what is happening in space and what is happening to the Earth. Other satellites help us communicate with people all over the world. Weather satellites tell us what the weather will be like, so we can get ready for bad weather. The biggest satellite is the International Space Station. Astronauts from all over the world live and work on this satellite. The astronauts collect information and send it back to Earth. Satellites use energy from the sun. They collect sunlight and turn it into electricity. Today there are thousands of satellites in space.

A tsunami is a very big wave. It can happen when a lot of water moves suddenly. Underwater earthquakes often cause tsunamis because the ground at the bottom of the sea moves a lot. A tsunami wave can travel very quickly and very far. A tsunami can be 35 metres high, like a ten-floor building. It can move very fast, up to 970 km an hour. Tsunamis can kill people and animals and break down buildings. After a tsunami there are often floods, which cause more damage to the environment. We don't usually know when a tsunami will happen. Sometimes we know because the sea water moves a long way back from the beach.

The sun is a big star in space. It is the only star we can see in the daytime. It is a very big star – we can put a million Earths in it! There are eight planets in the solar system. They all go around, or orbit, the sun. Earth takes 365 days to go around the sun. That is one year. Mars is further from the sun than Earth. This means it takes Mars 687 days to go around the sun. So, one year on Mars is 687 days!

Many planets have a moon too. A moon is small and it orbits a planet. It takes our moon 27 days to orbit Earth. Some planets have lots of moons – Saturn has 62 moons!

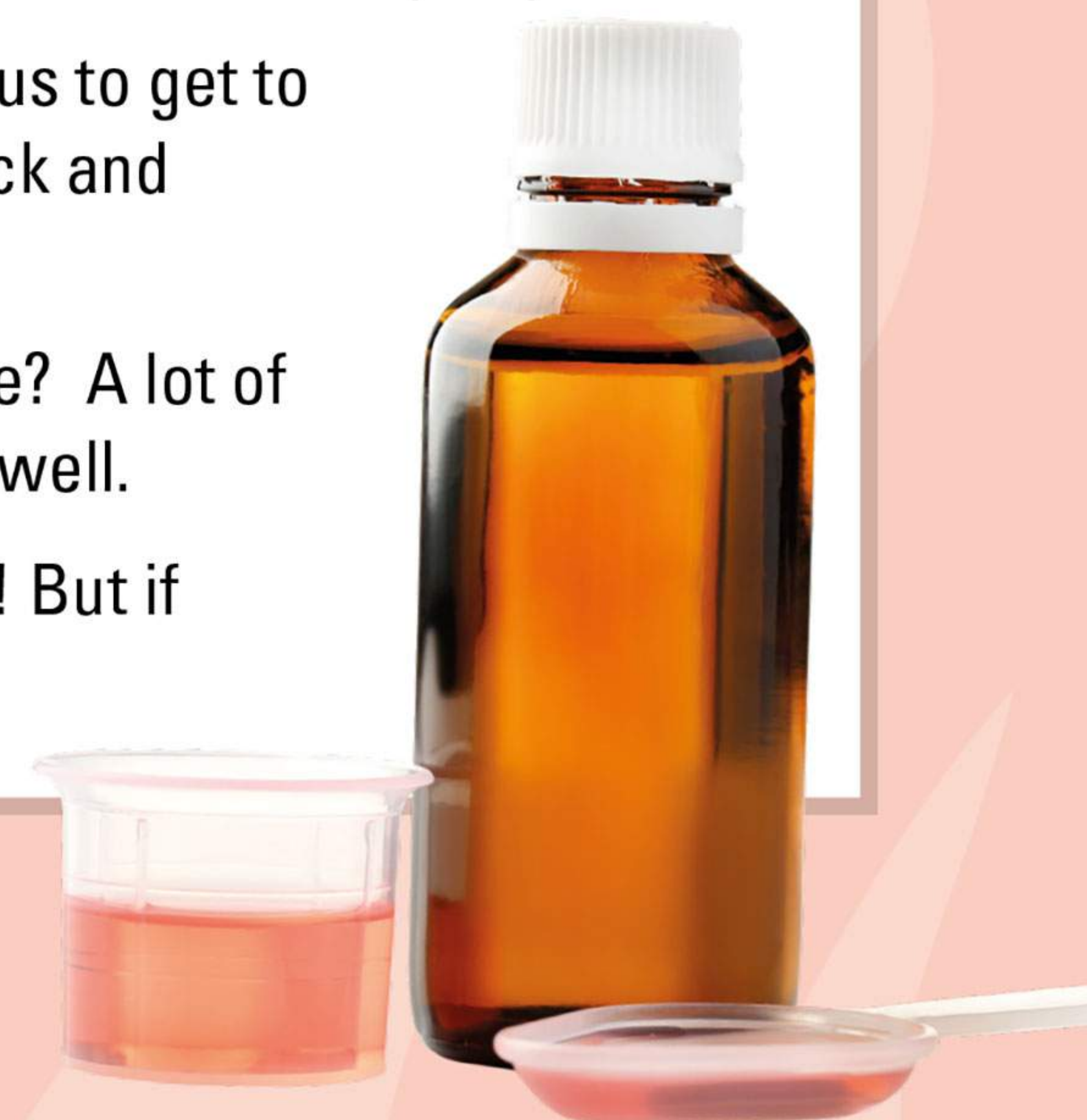
WHY DO WE MEASURE THINGS?

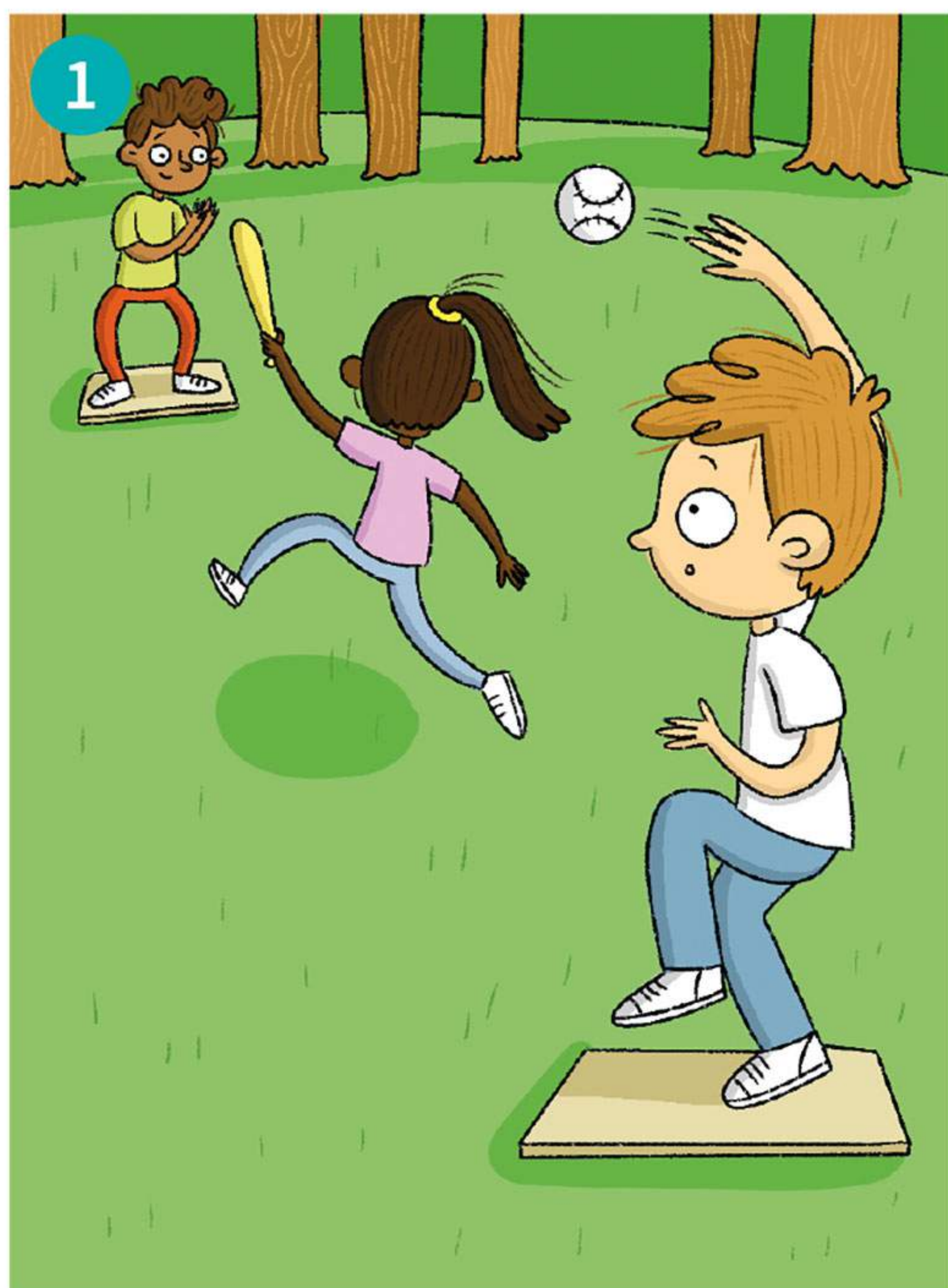
